



2nd Annual K9 Cancer Walk Brings Colorado Dog Owners Together to Fight Canine Cancer—Registration Now Open

May 12, 2010/Denver, Colo.— Join Morris Animal Foundation (MAF) and Colorado dog lovers at the [2nd annual K9 Cancer Walk](#) at Stanley Park, in Estes Park, Colo., on Saturday, August 21. Early registration, which closes August 7, is \$30 for adults and \$15 for children age 10 through 17. All funds raised will benefit MAF's Canine Cancer Campaign.

Walk-day registration is \$35 and begins at 8:30 a.m. The event includes a short and long lake walk starting at 10:00 a.m. After the walk, participants can visit with vendors; listen to experts discuss cancer prevention, treatment, wellness and cancer research; and learn how to advocate for their dog's health.

Supporters who are not able to attend the walk in Estes Park are encouraged to participate in [Sit & Stay](#) program, which gives dog lovers a chance to virtually participate in the walk—and help dogs enjoy longer, healthier lives from the comfort of their couch.

An estimated 50 percent of all dogs will battle cancer. It is the No. 1 cause of death in dogs over the age of 2. MAF launched the K9 Cancer Walk program as a way to raise funds for its [Canine Cancer Campaign](#), which funds prevention and treatment research to help dogs enjoy longer, healthier, cancer-free lives. Participating in this walk is a great way to memorialize a beloved dog lost to cancer, celebrate a dog who is a cancer survivor or create a brighter future for a current canine companion.

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
